I was ordained to the Holy Diaconate by Metropolitan Methodios of Boston, in 2004 at St. George Greek Orthodox Cathedral in Manchester, NH where I served as Deacon for four years while continuing to work in my lay profession, Computer Aided Design. In 2008, the Metropolitan ordained me to the priesthood at Sts. Peter and Paul in Haverhill, MA. After leaving my lay profession, I finished my study at Holy Cross Theological Seminary and was graduated in 2009, Master of Theological Studies. I have degrees in Music Theory (B.A., University of New Hampshire, 1974), and Music History and Theory (M.A., Rutgers University, 1977), and I have taught music at U.N.H. - Manchester, U.N.H - Durham, and classical guitar at Plymouth State College. awarded to NH Work Opportunity Council to serve approximately 250 Jac Pac dislocated workers. She was one of the founding members of PeopleFest, a multicultural festival held in Manchester, NH.

We have two children, Andrea and Michael. Our daughter Andrea lives in Brooklyn, NY and works as an architect for the firm of Pei, Cobb and Freed in N.Y.C. Andrea is the artist in our family. During her graduate school summers she worked on the Greek island of Samothraki doing drawings of the archeological excavation at the Sanctuary of the Gods. Our son Michael lives in Swanzey, NH with his wife Tiffany and their children, Brianna and Dana, where they are active in rural community life. Micheal is the musician in our family. He teaches music in the Townsend, MA school system. He spent his college summers working at the Tanglewood Music Festival, the summer home of the Boston Symphony, and on weekends, he may be found playing percussion for such diverse musical venues as a bagpiper, an historical marching band, or a chamber orchestra.
