Dear Brothers and Sisters,

A few weeks ago, I had an interesting conversation with a parishioner who recently moved to the United States from a traditionally Orthodox country. She lamented that here she doesn't "feel" Orthodoxy the way she does in her native land. Back home, Orthodoxy subtly pervades everything: most people you meet and talk to are Orthodox, there are churches on every street corner, and the civil calendar follows the major feasts and fasts of the Church. Even if most people in that country aren't especially religious, our faith is still quietly present in the background of everyday life. This woman observed that it's much easier to feel connected to the Church when she is so easily accessible.

I believe that this is quite correct: in ordinary American life, there are few things that readily call us back to our Orthodox faith. Our schools, workplaces, shopping centers and recreational facilities (i.e. the places we spend the vast majority of our time) generally lack any hint of *anything* transcendent, let alone Christian. The churches we see around town are sometimes beautiful, but often uninspiring and almost never Orthodox. Of all of the Great Feasts, the American calendar only recognizes Christmas and Easter, and even these in only a very secularized and commercialized form. If we are surrounded by any coherent culture, then it is a bland consumer culture, and not something that allows us to connect organically with God at all, let alone His full glorious revelation in Orthodoxy. We are in a spiritual wasteland, but most of the time we don't notice it — it sometimes takes an outsider to remind us of what's right in front of our faces.

The spiritual poverty surrounding us means that if we are passive, if we just "go with the flow" of American society and live our lives on a sort of "autopilot", we will inevitably drift into the emptiness that surrounds us. There are no cultural guardrails which will guide us back to the Church like those that exist in Greece, Romania, Lebanon or any other country with deep Orthodox roots. We are more responsible for our own spiritual well-being in the United States than anywhere else, and we need to take that responsibility seriously.

This does not mean, however, that our situation is hopeless. In fact, I believe we have a very exciting opportunity in front of us. In America we do not have a pre-constructed Orthodox culture handed to us; instead, we are responsible for building it ourselves. All we need to do to develop this process is to be intentional about our Orthodox faith. We need to go to Orthodox churches, take pilgrimages to monasteries and shrines, take time off of work and school to celebrate great feasts, participate in Orthodox summer camps and schools, say our prayers with

our families, and put icons around our homes. The more effort we put into our spiritual lives, the more we are building American Orthodoxy.

As conversions to Orthodoxy gain momentum across the country, we have the opportunity to build churches, institutions, and especially families, the raw material out of which an American Orthodox culture will emerge. This culture will bear heavy influence from Greek, Russian, and Arabic culture, but it will also be something unique and new, something that American Orthodox Christians feel naturally and effortlessly a part of. We must exert intentional effort now, so that our children and grandchildren will have a Church they feel organically connected to, and in this country, we will see and experience the spiritual richness of places like Greece, Romania, and Lebanon.




