Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I was quite pleased with the Drive-Thru Greek Festival this past weekend. While many people both within our community and outside it had their misgivings about not doing a "traditional" Greek Festival this year, ultimately that was not as big of a problem as some predicted. The reviews of the festival, its food and its atmosphere were overwhelmingly positive, and it seems that everyone was able to adjust fairly easily to the new format. The Festival was certainly a success as an event in and of itself.


But more than just as an event, the Festival is notably a fundraiser that primarily serves the needs of Holy Trinity, and secondarily supports a number of local charities. In this respect, the Festival also appears to have been a success. While we will not have the final numbers for a while, it seems certain that this year's Festival will bring in a healthy profit which will benefit our community and others in tangible ways. We should be grateful that the organizers of our Festival are not just good event coordinators, but also shrewd businesspeople. However, as the priest of this parish my concerns are less about the material side of this event and more about the spiritual: what, if anything, does the Festival do for our church in that regard?

I have met cynics in other Orthodox churches who see food/ethnic festivals as mostly harmful. By focusing the attention of the community on culture or business, they distract from the mission of the Church dilute the spirituality of the parish. While it might be tempting to write such people off as narrow-minded or overzealous, I must confess that there are times and places where they are exactly right. I have seen parishes and parishioners who are far more interested in turning a profit or preserving their ethnic identity than they are in worshipping Jesus Christ. This is extremely problematic, because such a church has completely lost its purpose and thus has no justification for its continued existence. Jesus condemns Christians who lose their spiritual orientation with the following words, "You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men." (Matthew 5:13)

Fortunately, I can say sincerely that I believe our community has its heart in the right place. Our people enjoy having a good time, they're good at making a bit of money, and they're proud of their heritage. But most importantly, they understand that the reason this community exists is for the worship of God and the teaching of the Orthodox Faith. My conversations throughout the weekend with volunteers and organizers alike confirmed for me that they understand that our unity is a spiritual unity because we are bound by one Baptism, and our mission is a spiritual mission, because our goal is the Kingdom of Heaven. I believe that for as long as we understand our core purpose and

values, God will continue to bless our Greek Festivals and whatever else we put our minds to as a community. Thank you for all of your hard work.



Weekly Classes & Worship




Bible Study is on Wednesdays at 7pm


